



Non-residential trips do not require deposits until finalised places in February 2019.





# Holocaust Trip (Y9)

5 Days—Krakow/Auschwitz

## Learning focus of activity:

- Evaluate the impact of the holocaust on the Jewish community during and after the second world war

## Link to the sustainability Stewardship focus for the week:

- Sustainability is about managing change, much of the trip will focus on the changes forced on the Jewish community as a result of the events of the holocaust. If, like the last trip, it is possible we will also meet with a survivor to discuss the gravity of the changes. Stewardship (theological definition) is about taking care of God's creation, Jesus taught that we should love our neighbours/one another. Obviously a focus of the trip is how we can learn from this to ensure that it never happens again.

## Link to the Academy ethos:

- The academy strives to develop a high quality education for all students; experiential learning is the best way to really get to grips with such difficult topics and ask the philosophical questions it raises. If we understand the issues we can develop our understanding and go on to better serve God; following on from this we can then show God's love to all through our actions and attitudes learnt.

- Understanding of the impact of the Holocaust on the lives of the Jews 2. Evaluate what life was like for Jewish people before and after the second world war 3. Question the existence of benevolent God
