What is the data showing? What can you infer from the data? Is it what you expected based on your geographical knowledge? Is it reliable?

What are you being asked to do? What order should you do things in? How should you present you answer?





Look for key command words.



Look for links with things you already know. Where have you heard these words or concepts before? What prior knowledge do you need to fully understand this?
